



Utility of online learning and feedback


Comparison of fit/unfit responses pre and post question change



- Original question 'should PT certify patient fit/unfit for RTW?' (58% correct = fit)
- More education added re when to certify 'fit'
- Marked improvement in certification (81% = fit)
- Additional question added to later case (reinforce learning) (96% = fit)




Confidence in understanding relevant policies and procedures

Confidence in the ability to correctly complete a certificate of capacity





Barriers addressed by education resource

- Consistent message
- Evidence-based
- Time efficient
- Wide-reaching
- Cost effective
- Tied to greater remuneration for treating therapists
- Multiple stakeholders involved in all stages of development



Where to from here?

- South Australia (RTWSA) have built on this model
 - Adapted to SA context
 - Addition of two further modules
- Opportunities to further expand this model of training
 - Within Physiotherapy
 - ? Other professions
- Need time to establish the effect on certification practices
 - Early signs mirroring the Occupational Physiotherapy program
